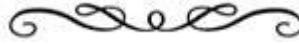

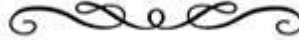

Mr. Forte stated this is in response to the workshop session that the Mayor and Commissioners already had. If they have any questions, Mr. McKinney is prepared to answer them.

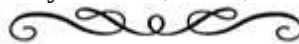
John McKinney, Finance Director, stated this mid-year budget does two things. This amends their overall fund structure and increases their budget overall citywide. As they discussed at the workshop, they are renaming, merging and creating several new funds throughout the city for additional accountability. This, overall, modification to their fund structure, does reduce their overall budget that was adopted of \$37,977,600.00. With all of the modifications to the budget, it reduces their overall city budget to \$35,359,399.00. If they take all those changes away and actually look at the net increase to the budget, the budget overall increased by \$407,099.00. On the sheet listed in the variance, it showed them what all the funds increase/decrease by and what he would like to highlight overall is the unrestricted column. What that shows are what monies are available in that particular fund over what the original adopted budget was. He definitely wants to highlight the General Fund. That increased by that amount strictly from projects in 301 that have either been delayed or cancelled or came in under budget and that money was moved from fund 301 back to the General Fund. The only real change that he wants to highlight is the creation of the two new funds for the current Fiscal Year, fund 501 Information Technology and fund 502 Fleet. Those expenses are still in the General Fund and all the other funds but he just wanted to highlight that those two funds were created in the total amount as listed above.

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8. PUBLIC HEARINGS

1. Ordinance

SECOND READING - Ordinance 3005 An Ordinance of the City of Holly Hill, Florida, Amending the Land Development Regulations, by Rezoning the Parcel Described in Exhibit "A" from B-5 (General Commercial District) to BPUD (Business Planned Unit Development); Providing for Conflicting Ordinances; Providing for Severability; and Providing for an Effective Date.

(Requested by Brian Walker, City Planner)

Brian Walker, City Planner, briefly went over the staff report with the Mayor and City Commissioners that was in their agenda packets and it's the same report that was

presented to them for first reading on May 22, 2018 at the regular City Commission meeting. On May 22, 2018, the Commission gave preliminary approval of the request but instructed staff to work with the applicant with regards to parking for Lot 5. Staff and the applicant have reached an agreement and the following language has been added to the BPUD Agreement. On Page 4, under the heading Development Agreement, letter D, subsection 2. The new/added language says, *“There shall be 8 parking spaces located in the parking area constructed on Lots 3 and 4 that shall not be used to satisfy any other jurisdictions' parking requirements and shall only be used to satisfy the parking requirements of Lot 5. However, there shall not be a requirement to identify with signage that specific parking spaces are reserved for Lot 5 only.”* Mr. Walker stated that is the only change. Based on this information, staff recommends that the City Commission adopt the Ordinance and enact in a rezoning from a B5 General Commercial to a Business Planned Unit Development (BPUD) and approve the associated Development Agreement as changed and Preliminary Development Plan for approximately 1.58 acres located on the east side of Nova Road approximately 600 feet south of 6th Street.

Mr. Forte informed the Mayor and City Commissioners that in their agenda packets is the old Development Agreement that doesn't have this new language. So, if their motion includes the language that's in there, he does have the final documents that he received from the attorney's that has the language in there but they didn't get into the agenda item. So, their motion should include that language should be included in Section D., Land Uses within the BPUD, Section 2.

Rob Merrell, Attorney for Cobb Cole, 149 S. Ridgewood Avenue, Daytona Beach, stated they had a lengthy and lively discussion at first reading and Mr. Walker did a great job telling the Commissioners what happened between then and now so if they have any other questions, he will be happy to answer them. Hopefully, the city will support us and welcome the Divia (?) folks to the community and hopefully more.

Mayor Penny opened public participation. No one spoke.

*Commissioner Via made a motion to **APPROVE ORDINANCE 3005 with the added language to read as follows, “There shall be 8 parking spaces located in the parking area constructed on Lots 3 and 4 that shall not be used to satisfy any other jurisdictions' parking requirements and shall only be used to satisfy the parking requirements of Lot 5. However, there shall not be a requirement to identify with signage that specific parking spaces are reserved for Lot 5 only”**, seconded by Commissioner Byrnes.*

Mayor Penny reminded the Commissioners that this is a quasi-judicial matter and if any of them have had any ex parte communications they need to disclose that now. For the record, he needs to say that he was at City Hall when Mr. Galloway was here and they were in negotiations with Mr. Walker and Mr. Forte. He happened to walk in on the conversation and they talked about football and kids and everything else and land development and Mr. Merrell was brought in on a conference call so, he was part of listening in on those conversations.

Commissioner Danio stated he talked to Mike about pizza, things that are important and

they did have some conversation on the other things as well.

Commissioner Currie stated she knows they probably all feel the same way; they welcome the new businesses because that is one direction that they are all heading into. She appreciates everything Attorney Merrell has done and Attorney Simpson has done, Mr. Walker and everybody else who has been involved. Great job and a good compromise.

Commissioner Via stated he would like to echo that. Thank you, Attorney Merrell for taking the concerns that the Commission talked about and he thinks it's going to be beneficial not only for Holly Hill but obviously for the applicants to market that property so that they can bring in a business to Holly Hill. Thank you for all the work that Attorney Merrell and Mr. Walker have done.

C. City Commission Comments

Commissioner Via stated himself and Mr. Forte had a good meeting today and they worked out a lot of issues and so he thinks there is just a few things that the Commission needs to talk about as a whole and he would like to start off by asking Mr. Forte if he could give the Commission an update on some of the park issues. Some of the park complaints that the city has received.

Mr. Forte stated he actually just responded to a citizen through email with regards to some of the parks. As they know, they've talked about the dog park, the possibility of relocating that to Hollyland Park but due to the conversations that they are having with the people from The Pickleball, that's not really going to be the case. He doesn't foresee that happening any time in the future. As far as Sunrise Park is concerned, they are still waiting...he sent an email out to each of the Commissioners a couple of days ago, that

the city did receive about \$800,000 back from FEMA. The city is still waiting on about \$1.2 million for some other debris hauling; that was for the first couple of days of Hurricane Matthew. As a result of those storms, they have seawall damage on both the north and south seawalls on Sunrise Park North. The piers are damaged and they are still waiting on FEMA to give the city any indication that they are going to improve reimbursement for the repairs of those parks. Last week he had an opportunity to meet with Randy Foltz from Marina Grande, he used to be one of the principles involved with the construction of the Marina Grande project, he's back in town and he's been hired to work on the repair of the pier at the Marina Grande so while he was in town, I asked him if he would have the folks that he has coming up from south Florida, if they would take an opportunity to go out to Sunrise Park and take a look at the two piers to see what, in their professional opinion, it would take to make those repairs and then based on whatever they come back with, it will give the city a good indication on what direction the city needs to go in. Mr. Forte stated as far as the irrigation system that he talked about, that's being inspected to see if it can go back into service. He spoke to Mr. Khoury about having city staff be recertified to be able to do weed and feed, fertilizer and weed killer applications on city property.

Commissioner Via stated there's a lot of things that are going on in the city's parks and he doesn't know if any of the other Commissioners have received any complaints about some things that haven't really been kept up to the standard, of which, he believes all of the Commissioners want to keep the parks. There was an idea brought up today that he wanted to throw out to the Commissioners. Since there are complaints about that, they can't be everywhere at all times, he thinks that it would be a good idea to start a "Park Advisory Board" and basically, they would oversee the parks and let the Commissioners know maintenance things, the beautification things that the city can do in the park and really be on top of that. He thinks it would go a long way for how the Commissioners want their parks to look because they need to take pride in their parks. They have some of the best locations all around. Is that an idea that anyone likes?

Commissioner Danio asked if that is a voluntary board?

Commissioner Via stated, yes. They would have to find people to appoint.

Commissioner Danio asked if he has had any contact with people that might be interested?

Commissioner Via stated, no. This is brand new. This came from a citizen today and he thought that it was a good idea.

Commissioner Danio stated it's a great idea. The problem is finding the people to get involved.

Mayor Penny stated he thinks the people that use the parks are the city's best eyes. Like Commissioner Via said; they're not everywhere all the time. The only concern he has with forming an Advisory Board is that there will be an attendance requirement. If it's a city sponsored board, minutes have to be kept, a secretary has to be responsible for that. He doesn't know if they might be creating more bureaucracy than necessary. Maybe they need to...Mr. Forte and himself have talked and he knows that Commissioner Via has

talked with Mr. Forte today about it, they talked a couple of weeks ago about some of these issues. They might want to see how far they get with some of these issues and then it might be as simple as a suggestion box rather than recreating an entire bureaucracy of a board, put out a suggestion box. He knows Mr. Forte has instructed staff to go by and report on a daily or weekly basis, some of the things that may or may not have been paid as closely attention to as might need to be. Water faucets and things like that. He is all in favor of increasing the quality of their parks. He just doesn't know how they get there. He just doesn't want to create some monster and not have people come and then they have to disband a board. They tried the Civil Service Board, the Beautification Board was tried. The Historic Society actually asked the city to disband them and set them free on their own. He hears Commissioner Via. He just doesn't know if that's the best solution at this time.

Commissioner Via stated they have a lot going on with their parks right now. For instance, with Sunrise Park, hopefully, they're looking at this grant to bring in this new exercise program and then the city has the splash down in the park coming, the city will have events there. They also have the Dog Park, which he believes it would be good to have citizens to...when issues come up and are related to the park, that the city can pass it through them. That's why he thinks it would be a good idea. If there's any other input from any of the other Commissioners, he would love to hear it.

Commissioner Currie stated she would definitely love to come up with some conclusion to be able to continue with the wonderful parks that the city has but improving the quality of what they offer. They definitely need to hash out a little bit. They are supposed to be having more workshops in the future, maybe that can just be a topic that is slid in on one of their workshops.

Commissioner Via stated, yes. He agrees and he's not asking for a decision tonight. If the Commission told him...

Commissioner Currie stated normally when they workshop...

Commissioner Via stated no way then...

Commissioner Currie state they've come up with a lot of good ideas and things of that nature when they workshop it.

Commissioner Via stated they would have to come up with responsibilities and what would go to the board, etc. and so on.

Mayor Penny stated he agrees and it should come up in a workshop. Something as...he thinks, we as Americans, we as people typically do, is they build things and never really plan to maintain them and a lot of these things we have good intentions and the fall to the budget floor because we have pothole's or our health insurance goes up. He thinks this is an important topic that they are going to have to bring up at budget time and set something aside. They all want beautiful grass but they need to make sure they budget for it.

Commissioner Currie stated but even if they can agree to a workshop.

Mayor Penny stated, definitely.

Commissioner Danio stated there's nothing wrong with that.

Commissioner Byrnes stated he's okay with that but he thinks to keep it at the top of the bubble but maybe under communications they can add a "parks report" and have public input so that the Commission can say, "here's what's going on in the park". If somebody has a complaint or a suggestion and then they can come up and then the Commission can tell Mr. Forte, "yes, what that person suggested is good, let's go with that", or "no, that person should go to a park in Ormond."

Mayor Penny stated so they will put it on a workshop schedule.

Commissioner Via stated, yes. Let's do that. His last comment, and this will go with the workshop but they need to start looking at...he visits Sunrise Park as he visits many other parks and the Dog Park is one of them. Since the city has a crew of inmates that the city is only getting half of what the city wants to be getting from the crew because there's not enough inmates to that day to be cutting the city's grass and whatnot, sometimes there are lapses to where grass can get too high, there's weeds, and that happens. Unfortunately, for some people, when they go out they may just see that. They didn't see the week prior when it was cut or two weeks prior. He thinks they need to look at, also, what are the standards for the parks. He thinks, and this goes to a budget question, if the city wants higher standards with their parks then they need to budget for it. They need to figure out a way. Maybe they need a park ranger to look after some of these things, maybe they need to have a dedicated crew just to the parks alone. He doesn't know. Just throwing out some ideas.

Commissioner Currie stated she thinks they tried the park ranger idea back, three or four years ago and that didn't work out so well.

Commissioner Via stated, right. He's not sure how that went but he would like to find out more information.

Commissioner Currie stated it didn't go well.

Mayor Penny stated he thinks it's something that they need to readdress. Everyone sees the beautiful Palm Trees on US1 and this Commission decided that, that investment of tax dollars was so important that they needed to maintain that and the inmates will not be cutting that. The city just signed a three year contract for a maintenance crew.

Mr. Forte stated, not yet.

Mayor Penny stated or they are about too.

Mr. Forte stated they are going to put it in the next budget.

Mayor Penny stated but they are going to make sure that's maintained. They talked about Hollyland Park and he flashes back 40 years ago when that was like Shea Stadium, everything was manicured and now it's turned into a sandbox because they haven't maintained it. They've done a poor job at it and they can do better. He agrees with Commissioner Via.

Commissioner Via stated and these are concerns coming, strictly from citizens and he

wanted to bring it up to the Commissioners and see what their thoughts were.

Commissioner Currie stated and she thinks those are valid topics for the workshop they are going to have.

Commissioner Via stated, perfect. With that, their one listener online is probably his dad so he will take this opportunity to say, "Happy Father's Day dad", hope you're listening.

Commissioner Danio stated the Palm Trees and everything looks great. They did a good job with all of that. Wished everyone a Happy Father's Day.

Commissioner Byrnes stated it's neat when the political season comes because you find out rumors about yourself. Now, I usually sign up to run during the qualifying week and I often wait until the last day but I will tell you with certainty that there's one thing that I'm not doing. I am not running for Mayor. Vikki has had six people come to her and say, "hey, we want signs." I am not running for Mayor. Anything else I'm running for, we will find out because I am still trying not to be in the politics. I'm trying to do this job and I don't want any politics swirling around until that time when it's supposed to be. In my book. Not that anybody else has done anything wrong. I'm not saying that. I'm just saying in my own mind, I don't think it's the time. I'm not running for Mayor. So if you've heard that, if you made bets in Vegas, you've lost. Commissioner Byrnes stated the City Manager, there's been some people saying some things that weren't very nice and he doesn't know if folks realize what happened at the Florida League of Cities meeting two or three weeks ago, Mr. Forte received the *Government Executive of the Year Award* from the League of Cities because this City Commission supports him 100%. Mr. Forte is doing a wonderfully, tremendous job. So if someone, somewhere tells you that the City Manager is not doing a good job, look them right in the eye and say, "you are ignorant", because the City Manager has done a marvelous job, in this Commissioner's eyes, every day that he has been here. Do we agree on things 100%? Certainly not and that's part of government. Commissioner Byrnes stated he hates the rumors during election time. His political future, everyone will be able to find out about that. It looks bright and it looks great.

Commissioner Currie stated she loves looking out into the audience and seeing so many faces, it just thrills her. She loves seeing so many people coming out wanting to be involved in city government. Please keep coming back. Thanked staff for all of their hard work. She appreciates everything that they have been doing to help make this city the wonderful place that it is to live, work and play. She couldn't ask to live in a better city.

D. Mayor's Comments

Mayor Penny stated Commissioner Via talked about Father's Day and wished his father a Happy Father's Day thinking he was listening online but he wasn't (he's here in the audience). He knows that Commissioner Via is blessed to live a couple of miles away from his father and I'm blessed to still have my dad alive. He knows that many people have father's that are deceased and many people have strange relationships with their fathers. His wish for everyone would be to pick up the phone on Sunday and call them if you are able to or send them a post card and just tell them you're thinking of them and hopefully you can build that relationship because you never know when it's over. Life is too short to not have that type of relationship. I'm so blessed to have most of my family

within 25 miles of my house. Mayor Penny wished everyone a Happy Father's Day if they are fathers.
