2. DISCUSSION ON THE FUTURE OF THE OVERHEAD TO UNDERGROUND PROJECT - RIDGEWOOD AVENUE

There was discussion amongst the Mayor, City Commissioners, and staff in regards to the future of the Overhead to Underground project along Ridgewood Avenue. There was consensus (excluding Mayor Via) from the City Commission to move forward with Phase II of the Overhead to Underground project along Ridgewood Avenue. Mayor Via believes that the money could be spent in a better way and could make a bigger impact on the city.

3. FUTURE OF CRUISIN THE HILL CAR SHOW

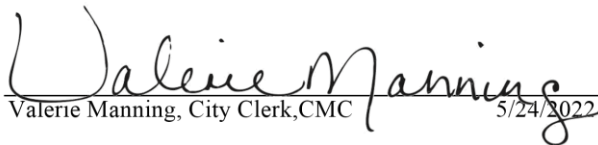

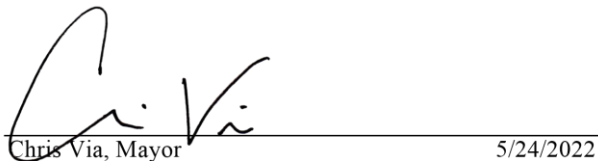
There was some discussion amongst the Mayor, City Commissioners and staff as it pertains to the old Smokey Yunick property located at 957 N. Beach Street. Roland Via, former Mayor of Holly Hill was present with Tony Cassata who spoke briefly about the memorial monument that they, along with Steve Miller, and the club they have created, would like to have placed on Riverside Drive at the park right next to Marina Grande facing the old Smokey Yunick property. The Mayor and City Commissioners supports a memorial monument but not a way finding sign and there was consensus that they would like to look at the design first before they commit to have monument placed there at the park and Mr. Cassata can meet up with Mr. Forte and show him the exact location they would like to place the monument.

Commissioner Penny brought up for a brief moment, the home inspection program for rentals - long or short-term rentals, that the city used to have and it was removed by a previous city manager. There was consensus from the Mayor and Commissioners to bring that program back to the city. The city can implement the old program that they had and charge more than \$25 for the inspection, to get that rental inspection designation. Make sure that they talk about safety, they're not going to catch on fire.
